## MARCIE'S STORY



Marcie Mazzola was a beautiful young woman with a free and generous spirit, who laughed easily and created a sense of peace amongst those around her. She was highly intuitive and had a compassionate nature that led her to help others, especially children.

On July 6, 2002, shortly after her 21st birthday, Marcie died tragically in a car accident on her way home from work. During her short life she succeeded in making a difference in the lives of all who knew her.

At the time of her death, Marcie was involved in a civil suit against a school bus driver who sexually assaulted her when she was 11 years old. The case had previously gone to court, resulting in the acquittal of the perpetrator. This outcome did not stop Marcie though, and at 19 she hired an attorney on her own to courageously resume the case. Marcie's attorney felt that her case was strong and he was confident she would win. But Marcie would not live to see the result of her efforts.

After her death, Marcie's attorney contacted her family, asking if they wanted him to proceed with the litigation, but cautioned them that without Marcie's testimony, it would be next to impossible to win the case. He also told them something that they didn't know. Marcie had confided in him that if she won the case, she planned to donate her entire settlement to help abused and at-risk children. Marcie's family and her attorney pursued the case against all odds and the estate won the civil suit. Her family established the foundation as a tribute to Marcie and to continue her legacy by helping children in need.

# Help a Child in Need

After Marcie's death her family and friends saw butterflies everywhere, in all seasons and they still do. As a celebration of Marcie's life her family established the Foundation using the butterfly as its identifying logo. Marcie's plan to help abused and at-risk children continues.

The Marcie Mazzola Foundation hosts innovative fundraising events to raise money to distribute to various organizations that support abused and at-risk children. The Foundation carefully screens potential organizations to ensure that donated funds are maximized to specifically help children.

The Annual Butterfly Auction and Dinner Event is held each Fall. A 4-Mile Run/Walk is held annually to provide YMCA Summer Camp Scholarships for underprivileged children in the community.

### Your generous donations have helped the following organizations:
